A message from Malcolm

GOOGONG'S PROJECT DIRECTOR

The construction of Googong continues steadily. Registration of subdivision Stage NH1A Stage 7A (43 lots) is imminent. This brings the total number of completed blocks in Googong North to 1,594 and works are underway on a further 138 lots in Neighbourhood 1B Stage 8 and Neighbourhood 1A Stage 7B. There are around 850 homes now occupied and a further 250 under construction.

The Development Application for Googong Central is to be considered by the Joint Regional Planning Panel on 8 December 2017 and construction is expected to commence in this area by mid 2018.

Design of a signalised upgrade to the intersection of Old Cooma Road and Googong Road is complete and is awaiting approvals. Construction is expected to commence early next year. Following soon after this will be QPRC's upgrade of Old Cooma Rd which has been brought forward following the NSW Government's announcement of funding for the project earlier this year.

GOOGONG LANDSCAPING

As we near the end of 2017 we have the chance to look back and take stock of what has been achieved in 2017 and what to expect in 2018 in terms of open spaces at Googong.

November will see the official opening of Yerradhang Nguru, at the Eastern end of Aprasia Avenue, with an Aboriginal Cleansing Ceremony. This will be undertaken by representatives of the traditional custodians, the Ngunawal, and attended by various other community representatives including the Mayor of Queanbeyan Palerang Regional Council Tim Overall.

Within Montgomery Rise, Munnagai Woggabaliri, the centrally located open space and associated playground, is complete. Munnagai Woggabaliri will be linked to Yerradhang Nguru via the Googong Common network of paths and trails which will be opened in November as well. The path system of the Common provides residents with access to the Montgomery Creek corridor via either a concrete path or a network of bush trails and log bridges that cross over the creek. For the last two years extensive weed control and replanting works have been undertaken to help stabilise and repair erosion within the creek corridor with a view to providing a natural landscape environment for residents and visitors to enjoy.

The Googong North Community Garden has received its license from QPRC which should result in lots of late Spring, early Summer activity in the garden. Come and see the garden for yourself which is located on Helen Circuit. If you would like to join the community garden or be a regular visitor contact the Googong Residents Association who will be running the garden on behalf of the Googong Community.



Googong's second dog park will officially open its gates in November as well. Located at the Northern end of Duncan Fields this dog park features a path network, shade shelter, seating, extensive tree planting, pond, play tunnels and a giant entry statement – to be revealed at the opening.

Coming up in 2018 design work has commenced on the open spaces within Neighbourhood 2, the Town Centre and on Googong's outdoor netball facility within the Googong Common which is planned to be open for the netball season in 2019. Works associated with the netball facility will include the completion of an additional 2km of the planned Googong Common path network.

From an environmental point of view we are completing an audit of the Pink Tailed Worm Lizard population within the Aprasia Conservation Area to inform us on how their existing population is developing; we have commenced revegetation works on Nangi Pimble to provide fodder and habitat for the Glossy Black Cockatoo; and our weed control, stabilisation and revegetation programme continues within the Montgomery Creek corridor adjacent to Montgomery Rise.

GOOGONG NORTH VILLAGE CENTRE

Developers, Googong Projects P/L, are expecting to complete the construction of the Village Centre in early 2018, with tenants moving in as their fit-out is resolved in the weeks following.

Works on the childcare centre, Our Place, have shot ahead with external landscaping commencing in November and the building is scheduled to be completed by the end of this year and available for intake in early 2018.

Civil and landscape works for the residential and retail building are also underway, and will be complete by Christmas. The building itself will open during January for fit-out, while the residential units should settle around March.

In September, Googong Projects P/L announced the appointment of IGA as the supermarket and liquor tenant. Works on this part of the building have been paused to accommodate planning for their specific fit-out requirements, meaning that they will look to start internal fit-out in mid January for a trading opening in March 2018.

The additional allied heath and retail shops are linked in terms of traffic volumes to the opening of the supermarket, and are also subject to progress of subdivision/strata titling and individual fit-out programs, but we do expect that these will also open in March. We can confirm that Discount Pharmacy, a dentist, Dominos, and The Butcher Boy are locked in as tenants; while the café, restaurant, cafe/bar, hair/beauty, and GP tenancies are still in negotiation.

This year's annual Halloween event, Boogong, attracted a staggering crowd of 20,000 people, zombies, werewolves, ghosts, vampires and clowns (mostly the evil variety). This makes it the biggest Boogong event so far – a 30 per cent increase on last year's crowd.

Googong Project Director Malcolm Leslie said everyone involved – including Googong's developers Peet and Mirvac – was delighted with the turnout.

"Boogong has really taken off," Malcolm said. "Thousands of people travel from all over the region to be here and the Googonian community turns out in force. This year we had a visitor from Italy as well as families from Queensland and across NSW."

Some incredible costumes could be seen on the day, with fans of Boogong putting in some serious effort to create some real showstoppers (or 'lunchstoppers' in the case of the some of the zombie makeup!).

This year's creepy circus theme was a big drawcard – the giant headless farmer, fire dancers, sword swallower and contortionist were all a huge hit.

"At its heart, Boogong is all about having some fun with your family and neighbours. But it's also a great showcase for the town, and for what has become a really warm and welcoming community," said Malcolm. "Events like Boogong, and our Googfest music festival in February, are a great opportunity to let other people experience a little 'Googonian spirit' for themselves."


