How we celebrated National Tree Day 2018



On Friday 29 July, a dedicated team of Googonians – big and small – got together to greenify Googong's future as part of National Tree Planting Day– Australia's largest tree planting and nature-care event.

Around 700 native grasses, shrubs and trees were planted along Montgomery Creek as part of a Molonglo Catchment Group and Conservation Volunteers project. Residents were supported by a great turnout of Queanbeyan Landcare volunteers.

Add to this The Anglican School Googong's amazing tree-planting effort for Schools Tree Day on 27 July, and it's clear that Googong's leafy future is all but guaranteed!

A message from Malcolm googong's project director

Hello again. I'm happy to report that everything has been proceeding as planned. Here are some milestones of note for our town.

- Registration of 4 new stages of subdivisions with NH1A Stage 7B (77 lots), NH1A Stage 6C (89 lots), NH1B Stage 8A (61 lots) and NH1B Stage 8B (39 lots) all occurring since my last update. This brings the total number of completed lots in Googong North to 1,901 and works are underway on a further 195 lots in Neighbourhood 2 Stages 1 and 2.
- There are now around **1,265 occupied homes in Googong**, with 260 more under construction.
- Upgrades to the **intersection of Old Cooma Road and Googong Road** are planned to commence in September (subject to final RMS approval), and should take around six months. Please drive carefully and with patience until construction is complete – and then we can all enjoy a safer and more convenient entrance to our town!
- Council are finalising the design of the upgrade of Old Cooma Road between Googong and Edwin Land Parkway – construction should kick off late this year. Again, this will greatly improve access to Googong, but will involve some inevitable delays during construction.
- Googong North Village Centre is close to opening the community is definitely coming of age.
- Construction of the upgrade to the water recycling plant which doubles its capacity is complete and is undergoing final stages of commissioning. Once commissioning is complete it is anticipated that Queanbeyan Palerang Regional Council (QPRC) will begin to use recycled water in the non-potable water reticulation network – residents will be advised when this is set to take place.
- Permanent water supply reservoirs on Nangi Pimble have been commissioned and the interim reservoirs, near the intersection of Old Cooma Road and Googong Road, have been removed to make way for the development of Googong Central. You may have noticed a significant improvement in water pressure as the new reservoirs come on line.

- A Development Application for the last stages of Googong North (comprising 103 lots) has been lodged with QPRC and is currently on public exhibition. The plans and reports supporting the application can be viewed at our Sales and Information Centre or at QPRC's office at Crawford Street.
- At the end of 2017 and the start of 2018, we opened a series of open spaces and parks including Yerradhang Nguru, Munnagai Woggabaliri, Googong North Community Garden and Barkley Park. We've now connected Yerradhang Nguru and Munnagai Woggabaliri via a track and trail system within the eastern corridor of the Googong Common. It's a more challenging natural walk along the banks of Montgomery Creek up to the lake at Montgomery Rise.
- Work within the eastern corridor of Googong Common is now focused on ongoing weed control and revegetation works. So far 3,500 plants have been re-established within the lower reach of Googong Common.
- In June, we commenced a pilot programme with Molonglo Catchment Group and Conservation Volunteers Australia aimed at involving you – Googong's residents – in future re-vegetation, weed control and stewardship of the natural environments at Googong. Eventually we hope to see Googong become part of the Queanbeyan Landcare Group so we can be even more actively involved in protecting the natural environment within the region. If this pilot programme is successful it is envisaged that the delivery of some of the environmental works at Googong will shift to a community partnership model. - Detailed design works are now complete on **Googong Common's outdoor netball facility and Googong's third sports field**. Works on these facilities will commence in earnest in December 2018 with a planned opening date of March 2019 for the netball courts and March 2020 for the third sports field. These facilities will be floodlit and include a major carpark facility.
- Design work is also well underway for the future entry from Old Cooma Road into Googong Town Centre. This work includes the main entry, Wellsvale Drive and the proposed lake to the north of the town centre. This exciting work will establish a focus for all future development at Googong and create a vibrant hub for residents and visitors to enjoy.
- In addition to the above infrastructure works, Googong and QPRC have been working on a Smart City Master Plan for Googong. In July we submitted a grant funding application to the Federal Government's Smart Cities and Suburbs Program. Funding will allow us to incorporate smart technologies into the infrastructure of Googong that will improve the liveability, productivity and sustainability of our town.

NEWS FROM THE ANGLICAN SCHOOL GOOGONG



Over the last few months at The Anglican School Googong, our students have spent time thinking about the local environment and learning how they can make a positive contribution to the community and their physical surrounds.

Year 7 began a study of the local area, examining our town's local fauna, and understanding the habitat, environmental conditions and threats posed to these animals. The students' hard work is now presented in a delightful book about Googong's ecosystem titled 'Classified Tails'. The book was published and is selling fast – you can pick up a copy from the School.

Our Junior School students have been learning about sustainability and recycling, about the different types of rubbish and responsible ways of disposing of their waste.

Kindergarten set up bins to categorise their waste, and led the charge in collecting together soft plastics and organised for the school to

begin recycling this type of rubbish. In addition, buckets for food scraps were placed in the playground, and have been happily received by many of our teacher's

chickens. Families were encouraged to think about how lunches were packaged and ways to reduce the rubbish produced during the school day. Year 4 and Year 5 were also able to visit the waste recycling centre, to further enrich their understanding of how they can contribute to a better future, as they explore the concept of 'Saving the World: Being part of the solution, not the pollution.'

All students contributed to the National Tree Planting Day by taking part in School Trees Day on 27 July. The school partnered with Googong Township, Molonglo Catchment Group and the Conservation Volunteers to plant 400 trees near Montgomery Creek in Googong.

On the day, the students also learned about the importance of native species including Kangaroo Grass. Also on hand to help were several parents, volunteers and teachers. The students will be returning to care for and water their plants in coming weeks.

At The Anglican School Googong, our students are encouraged to discover, dream and grow through inquiry-based learning and collaboration. Our school continues to grow and will cater for Kinder to Year 8 in 2019 and rolling out each year thereafter.
