#### A message from Malcolm

GOOGONG'S PROJECT DIRECTOR

Neighbourhood 2 Stages 3 and 4 are under construction and due for completion in January and March 2020 respectively.

NH2 Stage 3 includes the second (and main) entry to Googong from Old Cooma Rd which is well advanced and has been used as a useful detour around the construction works at the intersection of Old Cooma Rd and Googong Road. Upon completion of Stage 3, Wellsvale Drive will be extended to connect to Gorman Drive, providing residents with more options for access in and out of Googong.

The upgrade to the intersection Cooma Road and Googong Road is due to be completed in November 2019.

It is anticipated that DA approval of NH 1A Stage 4D and NH1B Stage 9 will be granted in September 2019. Following suggestions by the community as part of our consultation process, this will include an additional road connection onto Googong Road from Graziers Rd. Construction of these stages is scheduled to commence in the second half of 2020.

The next builders display village will be located on Courtney Street in Googong Central and comprises 19 homes from 15 builders. Construction has and is scheduled to be open in March 2020.

As advised in the last Googonian Newsletter, a permanent owner has been found for Club Googong. Canberra-based swim school operators, Aquatots, will take over the club from 1 October 2019. Aquatots has a very successful track record and offers a wide range of activities – from award-winning programs for babies from six weeks of age, to squad level swimmers, as well as general swimming and water education programs. Construction within the Googong Common North sports & recreation precinct is due to commence in September 2019. The first stage of development within this precinct will see the establishment of 6 outdoor netball courts, public toilet block, a temporary bike pump track, boardwalks across Montgomery Creek linking the sports precinct with the existing path system within the Common, BBQ facilities and off-street parking.

The first stage of the Smart Cities Initiative at Googong has commenced with smart lighting being installed along Old Cooma Road and Wellsvale Drive. In addition, Googong is trialling a smart pole within the Courtney Street park that will run the irrigation system via solar and wind power, establish the first of a network of environmental sensors at Googong and public WiFi.

Environmental work will be ramping up again as the weather improves. We recently launched our \$1m six-year partnership with the Molonglo Conservation Group to undertake additional conservation work for the Pink-tailed Worm Lizard. The 50:50 (Googong: NSW Government) co-funded partnership will see further mapping of the species and conservation practices within the south eastern corner of Googong as well as the greater catchment area from Burra to Wickerslack Lane. Googong Landcare are continuing with their stewardship of the environment with maintenance works focused on the revegetation planting on Nangi Pimble.

Googong's population continues to grow steadily with over 1,400 homes currently occupied, and a further 200 under construction.



Googong North recently took top honours for excellence in Masterplanned Communities in the Urban Development Institute of Australia for NSW/ACT. The category of masterplanned communities is one of the most competitive and prestigious categories and it is humbling to be recognised for our achievements. #### **Book Week - More than just fun!**



Many schools around the nation recently celebrated Book Week. This is an annual event that always fosters fun and festivity.
