GOOGONG'S PROJECT DIRECTOR

Hello again, Googong!

Googong's new main entry road, Wellsvale Drive, is nearing completion. Wellsvale Drive will connect to Gorman Drive and to a new signalised intersection at Old Cooma Rd. Subject to sign offs by QPRC and RMS, the entry should be open to the public by late March 2020.

Neighbourhood 2 Stages 3 and 4 are complete and going through the subdivision certificate and registration process. There are now around 1,560 homes occupied with a further 180 under construction.

An exciting new display village showcasing new innovations in home design is under construction in Courtney Street, and is due to open progressively from April 2020. At the same time, we will relocate our sales office from Club Googong to a temporary building within the new display village pending construction of permanent home within the town centre to open next year.

Construction within the Googong Common North sports and recreation precinct has commenced. The first stage of development within this precinct will see the establishment of six outdoor netball courts, public toilet block, a temporary bike pump track, boardwalks across Montgomery Creek linking the sports precinct with the existing path system within the Common, BBQ facilities and off-street parking.

Smart Cities deployment is well underway with pit and pipe infrastructure. Smart light poles have been installed along Wellsvale Drive. The Courtney Street smart pole continues to collect data and provide free local public Wi-Fi. Googong and its smart city partners are developing a website where Googonians can view data collected by

the system (such as weather and air quality) and assess the availability of smart services that will be deployed within the common (such as smart parking and BBQ availability). The smart system will also monitor bins and alert QPRC when they need to be emptied.

Googong and Molonglo Conservation Group are working collaboratively on the \$1m co-funded Pink-tailed Worm Lizard Saving our Species conservation initiatives. This includes establishing habitat for the species, and the installation of a perimeter conservation fence and walking trails which will be used by the Molonglo Conservation Group for guided educational tours. The final stage of the PTWL Conservation area will be established in March. The work involves the relocation of specific rock (favoured by the PTWL for hiding under) from areas slated for development, into the conservation area to encourage population growth for the species. Once the rocks have been relocated, the southern boundary fence will be established, and the conservation zone will be gifted to council.



Revegetation projects involving Molonglo Conservation Group and the Googong Landcare Group are under development. Year-long projects such as bird watch including bird box building are being developed. This summer has been the driest spell in the townships' short history. Together with QPRC, tree watering has taken priority over the last few months with more than 150,000 litres spread across the 10,000 + trees currently planted within the township.

People who travel south along Old Cooma Road will have seen a fence being installed around the Zone Substation. Screen planting around the fenceline will follow, with the blessing of Essential Energy. The screen planting will be intensively maintained for the foreseeable future to ensure longevity.

If you live around The Borough, you will have noticed a couple of dead remnant Eucalypts. Over the coming months, these trees will be pruned back and the remaining branches will be hollowed out to create bird nesting boxes to encourage native birds.

Many of you will know that earlier this year we made the decision to postpone our Googfest music festival from 2 February to 4 April 2020 due to the uncertainty around the smoke and fires regionally. We are excited to announce that Bachelor Girl will headline Googfest 2020, with support performances from Nathaniel, The Baker Boys Band and Aya Yves. This is a free all-ages event and everyone is welcome – so feel free to extend the invitation to your friends and family.



The staff at The Anglican School Googong shares their gratitude to those in our community who have helped fight the devastating fires across the country over the last few months. We are so grateful for the lives you have saved and the property you have protected and for giving your time and expertise so selflessly.

At the start of another school year, we have again seen significant growth in our school community. We are excited to welcome another 90 new students to the community and start the year with over 320 students across Kindergarten to Year Nine. With considerable waiting lists for 2021 already, we expect this level of growth to continue in 2021. The increase in student numbers has also necessitated growth in our staff cohort and we are excited about the depth and diversity our new staff will add to our already dynamic team.

Ensuring adequate infrastructure for our students and staff in a growing school community is a constant. Over December and January, six new modular classrooms were installed at the top of our site and have been aptly named 'Kosciuszko'. These rooms will cater for art and music lessons in addition to the general teaching spaces.



The learning vision in 2020 continues to be underpinned by encouraging our students to 'Dream, Discover and Grow' across all facets of the school life. Focus will remain on embedding Learning Power fundamentals, which develops resilience, reciprocity, resourcefulness and reflectiveness in our students. The effectiveness of the Learning Power principles was highlighted by our Senior School students at the Celebration of Learning Night in 2019. Students shared how the learning power dispositions had influenced and helped to transform their studies and personal lives, highlighting the overall effectiveness of a Growth Mindset.

1st Tinderry Scouts, is the local scout group for Googong, and it is growing, inclusive and very active!



As the school term begins for the year it brings with it the return of dance classes for over 100 local students attending Empire Performing Arts (EPA), Googong's very own dance school. Running up the stairs of the community center with hair tied in buns, dance shoes on and an undeniable excitedness to get back into classes, dancing in Googong for many local students has become more than just a hobby.

In April 2018 the local dance school opened its doors offering a few classes for the community. The popularity quickly grew, and the first end of year show saw 38 students confidently take to the stage.

With the local dance community eager for more, EPA started to offer a huge range of styles including Tiny Tots, Jazz, Ballet, Tap, Hip Hop, Lyrical, Acrobatics and Private lessons as well as some fitness classes just for the adults of the community. In 2019 the students all participated in another end of year show, this time with over 100 students and close to 500 guests supporting from the audience.

The growth of the school has been undeniable, but the most impressive achievement is that of all the students.

Many of whom have not taken dance classes before but have progressed quickly through levels achieving highly technical skills with the guidance and support of studio owner, Miss Katey. Having trained predominately in Ballet, Katey brings with her an in-depth knowledge of the Classical technique the dance school is built on. Along with her years as a dancer Katey consistently

achieves higher level qualifications and training across a range of areas including Advanced Acrobatics and Flexibility, Russian Ballet Training, Spinal Mobility and Injury Management all of which offer amazing benefits to the local dancers.

2020 will see the schools 2nd year in business and 3rd Annual concert and with all the changes that come with growth one thing remains the same, the mission of the school; to ensure every student receives equal attention and effort, that classes are always fun and that students' progress through levels at the highest possible technical standard.






