A message from Malcolm GOOGONG'S PROJECT DIRECTOR

The volume of land sales at Googong over the past four months has been more than double the long-term average and the development team has been busy ensuring we keep up with the demand. Construction of NH1B Stage 9 and NH2 Stage 5A was recently completed, NH2 Stage 5B is well advanced and NH1A Stage 4D recently commenced. Construction of NH2 Stage 9 will commence before Christmas heralding a shift in the development front to the south of the town centre and onto

the slopes of Nangi Pimble. This area has proven particularly popular with buyers, especially existing Googonians, given the amenity afforded by the surrounding open spaces, sporting facilities, planned public high school and spectacular views to the Molonglo Ranges.

Whilst the new Display Village in Courtney Street has been opening progressively since March, the formal launch of the village occurred at the end of October. The new home designs from Googong's Guild builders have attracted a lot of interest with big numbers visiting the homes.

It is covered elsewhere in the gazette but it is exciting that the recycled water produced by Googong's Water Recycling Plant will soon be flowing back to the township for garden irrigation and toilet flushing. This is an important sustainability initiative for Googong that has been years in the planning.

Construction within the Googong Common North sports and recreation precinct has taken longer than expected but is expected to open in December. The first stage includes six outdoor netball courts, public toilet block, a temporary bike pump track, boardwalks across Montgomery Creek and BBQ facilities.

Landscape work will start on a new local park within

Neighborhood 2 Stage 5 towards the end of this month.

This park will include a small shelter, circular path – great for learning how to ride, kick about area and smart bins and lights.

There are now about 1,790 homes occupied with the population standing at around 5,600.

GOOGONG INTEGRATED WATER CYCLE PROJECT UPDATE

Googong residents are advised that on 26 August 2020 Queanbeyan-Palerang Regional Council (QPRC) determined the Googong Integrated Water Cycle Project – Stage D Water Recycling Plant (WRP) and Permanent Reservoirs Review of Environmental Factors (REF). The REF was assessed and approved under Part 5 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979, subject to the management measures contained in the REF Statement of Commitments and additional conditions of determination.

Stages A, B and C of the project are complete and have been handed over to Queanbeyan-Palerang Regional Council for operation. The Stage D WRP and Permanent Reservoirs project includes an expansion and upgrade of the existing water recycling plant infrastructure located on Googong Dam Road and installation of a new concrete reservoir tank to hold the recycled water at the existing permanent reservoir site on Old Cooma Road.

Stage D is the ultimate capacity of the IWC Project. The purpose of Stage D is to support the ongoing development of the Googong township to increase the capacity of the existing IWC Project to 18,850 equivalent population (EP). The Stage D upgrades would also include allowance for a potential future capacity increase up to 19,550 EP.

The timing for Stage D construction will be confirmed as development of Googong township progresses. We currently expect that construction will be completed before the end of 2024.

DAYLIGHT SAVINGS

Day light savings has kicked off and the Googong Foreshores Reserve has extended opening hours but please ensure that you do not access the reserve outside these hours as it is an offence to do so. Rangers will be on site conducting land management duties and law enforcement patrols, often with NSW Police, Domestic Animal Control, Fisheries and Maritime officers who can issue on the spot warnings and infringement notices. Please remember that body contact with the drinking water in the dam is NOT permitted. Swimming and water-based play can be undertaken at the downstream river areas.

WAYS TO ENJOY GOOGONG DAM RESPONSIBLY THIS SUMMER



With summer around the corner it is good reminder to all members of the community that the Googong Dam and foreshores are open for permitted activities.

Googong Dam is a unique and precious resource for all. Keeping it safe means there are some things we can and can't do in and around the dam. There are many activities that are permitted. This includes anything that does not impact our water supply, such as bushwalking, picnics, and mountain biking on formed roads.

If you are spending time at the Googong foreshores during the summer, it is important to be aware that there is an increased risk of grass fires. This means no campfires. BBQs are only permitted where there are appropriate facilities.

You can help keep the foreshores pristine by taking all rubbish home with you. Remember, it is also important to leave pets at home.

If you are planning on enjoying the Googong Dam by water, it is essential to maintain boat hygiene. This means cleaning your boat, kayak, or canoe before you bring it to the Dam. It is also important to make sure your vehicle or trailer is clean. Algal, mud, fuel and oil as well as other debris can contaminate the water. Electric motors may be used on permitted vessels; however, petrol motors are not permitted at any time.

Even on hot summer days, please be aware that no swimming or bodily contact with the water is allowed.




Welcome new members!

Is your child Summer Swim ready?

Each year in Australia more people lose their lives in inland rivers, lakes, dams, and creeks than at beaches. Despite only a fraction of the population living in remote or rural areas, these regions are responsible for one third of all drownings nationwide.

To help reduce this horrific statistic, Aquatots runs a SwimSafer week each term to teach children important survival skills in and around the water. During SwimSafer week, children come dressed in old clothes and learn how to act in emergency situations, rescue themselves, and rescue each other.

At Aquatots we prioritize teaching children how to be safer in the water and this then becomes second nature to them as we revise these skills each term. Classes during this week are conducted in a safety circuit and children move around the pool to learn different sets of skills.
