Flagstone welcomes new Child Health Clinic

A new free Child Health Clinic has now opened in Flagstone. Operating from the Flagstone Community Centre on Trailblazer Drive, the Child Health Clinic is managed by Children's Health Queensland and will operate every Tuesday from 9.00am to 4.00pm.

State Member for Jordan, Charis Mullen MP, has welcomed the opening of the new service for Flagstone families, which provides a multi-age drop-in clinic in the morning and an appointment-based clinic in the afternoon.

'This is really great news and something I have been advocating for in our growing Flagstone community.'

'Providing a range of community health and support services for our local children aged 0-8 years and their parents/carers will hopefully give every child the best possible start in life.

'I encourage Flagstone families to take full advantage of the services provided through the Child Health Clinic,' said Ms Mullen.

Services are provided by Child Health Nurses and Early Intervention Clinicians (psychologists and social workers) through various ways including home visits, clinic-based appointments, drop-in services and parenting groups. Services provided include:

- Health assessments (growth and development surveillance and screening) for children 0-5 years as per the recommended Queensland schedule of child health checks.
- Early feeding and early parenting support for families with new babies.
- Information and ongoing infant/child feeding support.
- Immunisation information and immunisation clinics.
- Parenting support seminars and parenting groups.
- Individual interventions for specific parenting issues with a psychologist/social worker.



Wander around the large variety of boutique, handmade and novelty stallholders, grab some fresh produce




from the local food market area or just grab a bite to eat from one of the food trucks. Bring along your own picnic rug and chairs and enjoy the local live entertainment.

The Flagstone Community Centre Playgroups offer activities, games, craft, puzzles, singing, story time, music, dancing and more. Parents, grandparents or carers can stay to interact with other adults and to play with and supervise the children.

No child is too young for Playgroup. Children from 0-5 years love new experiences and benefit from developing sensory, social and communication skills through the varied activities.

They have toys for babies and a playpen for safe playtime, right through to educational and outdoor activities for the older children.

It is recommended that parents with multiple children come to the playgroup that suits their oldest child – the other children will be catered for as well but tend to develop skills quicker because they have a sibling to learn from.

The Flagstone Community Centre Playgroups are run by a registered teacher, parents who attend the Playgroup and some other special volunteers from the community. As per Child Safety regulations, anyone who doesn't have a child in the group must have a current Blue Card and have completed Child Protection training before volunteering. And of course, the Playgroups are run according to COVID safe regulations.

This is a great chance for Mums and Dads in Flagstone to have a local place to meet other parents while at the same time giving their children fabulous opportunities to learn, grow and thrive.
