
A message from Troy Thompson Flagstone Project Director

It's hard to believe three months has already passed since our last edition of Flagstone Focus... and what a busy time it's been! The end of the HomeBuilder Grant in March saw a lot of interest in the Aspire land release, with over a hundred lots sold in this neighbourhood since February! To keep up with demand, we now have close to 200 lots under construction.

I thought I should tell you a little bit about Peet, who together with our partners, Spirit Super, are the proud developers of Flagstone, one of Australia's fastest growing new cities and an amazing community whose residents are proud to call home.

Peet is one of the leading residential land developers in Australia and Flagstone is our biggest project — which is no mean feat considering we've been around for more than 125 years and have more than 60 major projects across all mainland Australian cities.

Our land bank is one of the largest of any ASX-listed property group and we pride ourselves on creating exciting, masterplanned communities that provide choice for homebuyers, just like we are doing here at Flagstone. Our capacity for innovation, creativity and creating connections means Peet can transform land into a place where people want to live — and thrive.



Town Centre

Speaking of thriving, we're excited with recent progress for the vision for the future town centre. Flagstone City will be flexibly designed, with people at its core.

It will be your city – at the heart of Flagstonian life – made for walking and intertwined with green spaces and distinct precincts that offer everything in one place.

Alongside multiple residential villages it will feature a retail core, eat street, a homemaker precinct, as well as specialist precincts for health, business, warehousing and trade.

Built for the long term, Flagstone City will provide jobs and infrastructure and will be a gateway to the region, preparing to eventually serve a thriving population of 150,000.





New sporting facilities coming soon

The Flagstone Tigers, the brand-new rugby league team kicking off in Flagstone, will start life with a new clubhouse. It will feature player change facilities, showers, toilets, a kiosk and meeting rooms.

I'm very pleased to advise that a \$350,000 Queensland Government investment and in-kind works by Peet is set to make the project a reality after a contract was signed with local Luscombe builders, ATCO.

Peet will provide in-kind works on-site to support delivery of the clubhouse project which will be a modular build managed by QBuild. The design has been completed and the clubhouse should be ready within the next few months.

The Flagstone Tigers will have the best possible start to their first rugby league season, playing at the Flagstone Sports Facility with this wonderful new clubhouse and amenities.

As a new master-planned community, Flagstone will eventually have 30,000 residents — with a further 120,000 across Greater Flagstone — so we need to start building the right facilities now.

It's important that the young people in our community have the opportunity to be involved in sport, not only for their health and fitness, but also for their wellbeing and social development.

The establishment of a new rugby league club contributes to building the community spirit and these new facilities are an important piece of foundation infrastructure for the club.

The Flagstone Tigers have begun with Under 6s to Under 9s in 2021. Next year, they will expand to older age groups, and the Brisbane Easts Tigers Rugby League Club are also working closely with the local schools to implement junior development programs.

This project is exciting for local families and will support more opportunities for Tigers Rugby League.

Green waste bins are coming to Flagstone residents who sign up from 1 July 2021, through City of Logan.

The optional fortnightly service is part of Logan City Council's new waste and recycling contract with Cleanaway.

Residents can choose to have either a 140-litre bin (\$46 per year), a 240-litre bin (\$51 per year) or a 360-litre bin (\$76 per year). A maximum of two green waste bins per property is permitted. And yes, even if you are a tenant, you can order a green waste bin. You just need to pay the 12 months in advance.

The lime-top bins can be filled with garden waste such as garden prunings, cuttings, palm fronds, weeds, leaves and grass clippings, which will be recycled into compost.

Soil and rocks should not be put into green waste bins.

So, make sure you join our Division 11 Councillor, Natalie Willcocks and order your bin. Natalie was the first person in Logan to register interest and has ordered a 240L bin! If you missed placing your order by 25 April 2021, you can still sign up. It just means your bin may be delivered after the commencement of the service.

The Flagstone Community Centre has been growing the number of services it provides right here in Flagstone to support individuals and families.

Mondays 9am-10am Logan City Council Immunisation Clinic

Immunisation is a simple, safe and effective way of protecting against harmful diseases.

The immunisation program offers the vaccinations listed under the National Immunisation Program Schedule and has vaccines available for purchase including dTpa (Whooping cough), Meningococcal and Influenza vaccines.

No appointment is necessary, though it is recommended you arrive at least 20 minutes before closing time. Please bring your Medicare Card and Photo ID. Clinics are closed on public holidays.

Tuesdays 9am-4pm Queensland Child Health Clinics

The clinic offers a wide range of services including health surveillance and screening, growth and development checks, early feeding support, nutritional information, parent support groups and counselling to enhance parenting.

Drop-in clinic open until lunch time, and by appointment after lunch (call 1300 366 039 to book). This is a free community service.

No issue is too small – come and speak to the nurses, gain confidence, and help your child thrive!

Wednesdays 10am-12noon Justice of the Peace Service

Among other things, a JP can witness documents, statutory declarations and affidavits, as well as administer oaths and affirmations. They can certify a true copy of an original document and issue search warrants.

No appointment necessary — just come on down. This is a free community service.

Thursdays 9am-4pm

Centre for Women & Co. Women's Counselling

Common experiences women seek counselling for include stress, anxiety, depression, effects of trauma and abuse, mental health, family and relationships, selfesteem and self-confidence building, grief and loss.

This is a free service for girls over 14 years of age and women. Appointments are necessary, phone 07 3050 3060 (then press 1 for the Beenleigh office). Ask for an appointment at the Flagstone service.

Fridays 9am-4pm YFS ParentsNext

If you're a parent on a parenting payment and want help getting into work or study when your children are older, contact us to see if you're eligible for ParentsNext.

Appointments are recommended. Phone 07 3826 1500. This is a free community service.

C&K Flagstone Kindergarten is colocated on the grounds of the Flagstone State School, in Flagstone's purposebuilt education precinct.

The kindergarten's Director, Senior Early Childhood Teacher (ECT) and Educational Leader, Sue Taylor, received the award for Excellence and Innovation in Pedagogy and Practice at the 2017 C&K Excellence & Innovation Awards. Central to Sue's success in winning this award was the unwavering commitment of Sue and her team to realising the potential of all children, building community capacity, and working alongside parents and community to develop resources as and when required. In 2018, Sue and her team were placed second in the state for two of three awards around Excellence and Leadership in Pedagogy.

The team of educators at C&K Flagstone Kindergarten brings a genuine passion for working with children, families, and the wider community, as well as a keen and critically reflective way of working in the early childhood setting.

Since 2018, C&K Flagstone Kindergarten have been working with the Yugambeh Museum to develop a suite of resources to introduce the children to the Yugambeh language, the language of the Traditional Custodians of the area, the Mununjali People. These resources are near completion and are due to be rolled out across Yugambeh Country this year.
