The Development Application (DA) for future Neighbourhood 3 has been approved by the State Government.

This neighbourhood is located to the west of the Latitude Release and is planned to include 5,000 new homes, new schools, a regional sports facility and park, ambulance station, retail and commercial centres. Approval of this DA is critical to the ongoing supply of land for sale and the growth of Flagstone.

Construction is complete on four stages in the Latitude Release. These stages are ideally located within walking distance to a future neighbourhood shopping and community centre and are surrounded by green ribbons overlooking Sandy Creek. Houses in these stages are starting to be built and when new residents move in they'll be able to enjoy the new Latitude Park which is due for completion in July.



Parks, parks, parks...

After community consultation, Latitude Park caters for all ages and will feature obstacles that align with ninja warrior, parkour and obstacle course racing (OCR) sports. It also has a nature inspired junior balance trail, sensory play equipment, kick about space and cycle path connection. The obstacle course will even feature a start/finish line with timer on site to compete against your friends. Plus all elements have a QR code to demonstrate how to use the obstacle and the muscles you will be working.

Since the last issue of *Flagstone Focus*, we also opened Flagstone's new Vista Park. At the launch event back in March it was great to see everyone enjoying the flying fox, kick about area and half-court basketball. Both new parks add to the already extensive parklands and green space here at Flagstone for residents to enjoy.







Commercial Areas

Our latest commercial land offering is nearing completion at the intersection of Branson Street and Gates Road. A development application has been lodged on one of the sites for a Flagstone World Gym, a large indoor sport and recreation facility. The fit-out is an Australian first that will include the latest layout trends from Los Angeles, California and state-of-the-art facilities for all members.

I'm sure many Flagstonians have also noticed construction on the Flagstone Tavern is progressing. We have been advised by the owner that they are hoping to be open in time for the Christmas break this year.







Peet embarks on reconciliation journey!


Peet Flagstone would like to acknowledge the Yugambeh-Bundjalung and Bandjalangic peoples, Traditional Custodians of the land on which our community gathers and pay our respects to their Elders past and present. We extend that respect to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples across Australia.

In recognition of National Reconciliation Week 2023, Peet was pleased to unveil the artwork that will support its Reflect Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP) which is proudly displayed in each Peet office around the country.

The artwork is designed by Chloe Watego, a Gubbi Gubbi-based woman with a strong connection to Flagstone. Chloe grew up in our Flagstone community with her family, and also built her first home here with her partner and children. Chloe is a self-taught, emerging artist with a passion for sharing and celebrating her culture through art.

The artwork shares the story of Peet's purpose - Defining future places of belonging - and the journey each person makes towards reconciliation through listening and engaging with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples. Peet's three cultural engagement principles developed in consultation with respected Aboriginal

Elder Dr Richard Walley -Place, Purpose, People - are represented in the piece using the three smaller green circle symbols, while the dot patterns around It represent Peet's vision - Imagine and realise future places where lives are enhanced by communities built on a sense of belonging. The blue mountains either side represent Peet's branding



As we continue this journey of belonging together, we respect Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples continued connection with Country and value the rich cultural contribution they make to the communities in which we live, work and play. We look forward to sharing Peet's Reflect RAP in the coming months.

Expansion of Child Health Services in Flagstone Warmly Welcomed

I am very excited to announce the expansion of our Child Health Clinic in Flagstone.



The Child Health Clinic was previously operating from the Flagstone Community Centre on Trailblazer Drive each Tuesday from 9am to 4:30pm. Due to the popularity and growing demand for the service within the community, Children's Health Queensland will now be at the centre every Tuesday and Wednesday from 10 July onwards.

This is really great news and I'm so pleased to see the service growing in Flagstone, a service I championed for our community. Under the wonderful care of Nurse Nicki Mageean or "Aunty Nicki" as she is sometimes called, parents are able to get one-on-one support for their child's growth and development, early feeding and parenting support.

I was delighted to meet local Flagstone couple, Ellisa-Raye and Ethan with their beautiful 7 week old twins Jack and Elizabeth who told me how convenient it is to have the Child Health Clinic so close and in the community. Providing a range of community health and support services for our local children aged 0-5 years and their parents and carers will hopefully give every child the best possible start in life.

The Child Health Clinic in Flagstone operates as a dropin clinic from 9am to 12pm (no appointment required) and Longer Appointment Consultations from 1:30pm to 4pm (bookings via 1300 366 039).

Flagstonian, Tyson Major is taking on one of the most grueling hikes in the southern hemisphere - The Kokoda Track in Papua New Guinea - to raisie funds for the Type 1 Foundation and has been actively creating awareness and educating the Flagstone community about the disease.

Tyson is taking on this mammoth task due to his own personal story which began in 2017 when he become very ill with Type 1 Diabetes. After some time in hospital, Tyson now has to check his sugar levels regularly, read the labels



and understand the ingredients in all he digests to manage his insulin intake correctly. It has been a steep learning curve to gain a new normal.

During his journey, Tyson developed depression and was financially, emotionally and physically spent. Being able to turn the corner and cope with his new life circumstances five years on, and now using an insulin pump that acts as his pancreas, Tyson feels he has the disease in hand and is enjoying life.

The Type 1 Foundation is a great source of help to diabetes sufferers and their families and Tyson is proud to be able to do his bit to give back to a great cause.







Flagstone State Community College

A grant from Logan City Council is providing real-world context for STEM learning at Flagstone State Community College.

The Catapult Program is proving to be an exciting opportunity, connecting our future thinkers to industry and business experts.

FSCC STEM ambassadors and Year 8 Design Technology students have been working through a range of activities and programs to help improve our school and wider community. So far, their ideas have included: brighter streetlights to reduce crime, drug awareness programs to prevent substance abuse, emergency service recruitment agencies to build a stronger workforce and fuel rewards for planting trees to better the environment and supplement cost of living. Soon, they will present their innovative ideas in a pitch to Jim Gleeson, Director of Plan C, a Brisbane-based company who deliver sustainable developments, infrastructure, enterprises and community led projects.

Opportunities for STEM learners don't stop here. Students in Year 8 -10 will this year participate in a three-day explorer program run by Young Change Agents. Similar to Catapult, students will identify community issues and ideate, validate, prototype and pitch a social enterprise to a judging panel. Our teachers will participate alongside their students as an immersion, which is the first stage of Young Change Agents' four stage teacher capacity building journey.



Design thinking is a common practice embedded into the teaching and learning that occurs in every FSCC classroom. It helps our young people to develop their:

- Problem solving
- Collaboration
- Communication
- Compassion

Through our ongoing support from Logan City, students are able to define their pathways to high-value employment, open doors into Logan City's innovation-driven economy and explore their entrepreneurial potential.

The workshop aimed to rehearse together as an ensemble and to introduce local primary school students to Instrumental Music.
