Join other 15 to 20 years olds every Monday at this music studio, and try your hand at producing, jamming and collaboration.

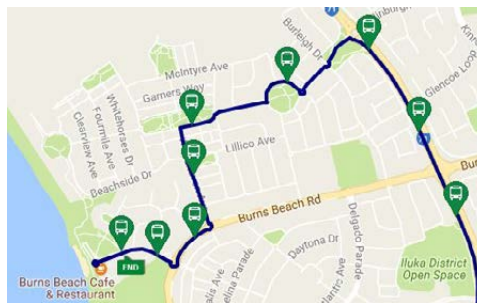

Following requests from community members and the growing number of Burns Beach residents, Transperth's 471 bus service now takes in Grand Ocean Entrance, Whitehaven Avenue, Burns Beach Road and Ocean Parade to the terminus at Burns Beach.

The service runs between Joondalup train station and Burns Beach operating during the week and varying times on Saturdays.

TOP 5 WINTER GARDENING TIPS!

As we head into the cooler months we've found 5 tips to keep your garden looking glorious:

1. Apply a good layer of compost
2. Top up and be generous with good quality mulch
3. Don't forget weeding is still needed this time of year
4. Avoid fertilising during winter when roots are dormant
5. Move your tropical potted plants into a protected warm spot



TIME TO TURN OFF

Don't risk a \$100 fine this winter – the sprinkle ban is now in full swing!

The ban applies to scheme and bore water users from 1 June to 31 August 2017, so be sure to switch off and save water.

If you're establishing a new lawn or garden, visit the Water Corporation at watercorporation.com.au to apply for an exemption.
