

A purpose built outdoor classroom near Black Swan Lake is now open. The new space will provide the opportunity for primary school students to study the flora and fauna of the lake and undertake monitoring projects.

The outdoor classroom located on the corner of Lake Valley Drive and Lilydale Drive features a seating area, blackboard and honky nut and leaf collection boxes.
