Record numbers for third Shorehaven Open Water Swim

It was perfect weather and calm seas for a record 248 eager swimmers who took part in Round 9 of Swimming WA's Open Water Swimming (OWS) Series at Shorehaven Beach on Sunday 11 February.

This exciting annual event created some serious competition in the water with the four races – 500m, 1.25km, 2.5km and 5km – all hotly contested.

The first male across the line for the 5km swim was Jack Wilson (from the under 18 category) who smashed the ocean water challenge in 55 minutes and 24 seconds. Jack was followed closely by last year's winner, Kieren Pollard (competing in the open category) who finished in just 55 minutes 28 seconds.

Swimming a personal best on the day, Jack who is aged just 16 said the conditions were almost perfect.

"It wasn't too windy and the water was good. I was pretty happy with my time which was a personal best," he said.

For the women, Tia Donovan took out the 5km win in just one hour, five minutes and 16 seconds. Tia was minutes ahead of female runner up Lillyan Rosich.

Tia, who is also just 16-years-of-age, again praised the Shorehaven conditions: "It was really good, a great day and really enjoyable. I was very happy with my swim and got a personal best which I am really pleased with."

The 2.5km swim was another nail biter with seconds separating first and second place with Kieren Jon Lawerson taking out the title.

Travis Kelly took out the 1.25km swim in just 17 minutes and three seconds.

Kieren Jon Lawerson and Travis Kelly are both aged above 35 and competed in the Legends category for the event.

Proudly supported by Peet Limited's Shorehaven at Alkimos estate for the third year running, the event also attracted hundreds of families, supporters and spectators to Shorehaven's landmark Waterfront Park.

Nova Cassanovas added to the atmosphere filling the park and Shorehaven Beach with music as the swimmers tackled the open water.

Waterfront Park set to grow!

Work on the second stage of the highly popular Waterfront Park has started, significantly expanding the public open space for everyone to enjoy.

The new space will include 5,000sqm of grassed area and landscaped gardens with thousands of new shrubs and close to 200 established trees. There will also be new barbecues, picnic settings, bench seating, shade and a playground installed.

The bigger Waterfront Park will be an exciting addition to the range of parks and open space already established at Shorehaven. The new works are set to deliver a high-quality outdoor venue suitable for a wide range of events, and extra space so even more people can come and enjoy the beachfront.

At the same time, additional landscaping will be completed along Portside Promenade creating an attractive point of arrival for visitors to Waterfront Park, the Shore Café and Restaurant.

The work is expected to be substantially completed by the end of the year, and is being undertaken by Total Eden who recently completed the Rise playing oval.

One hundred students for Shorehaven's Northshore in 2018

Northshore Christian Grammar School welcomed its 100th student at the start of the 2018 school year, which also marked the commencement of the school's inaugural Year 7 class.

The school also announced plans for Northshore Stage 2 which includes seven new classrooms, as well as an undercover sports area, dedicated science, art, D&T and industrial kitchen. Construction is due to start towards the end of the year.

"Welcoming our 100th student and the opening of Year 7 are both exciting milestones for our school," Principal Stuart Chisholm said.

"We're particularly proud of the strong sense of community that's been built, despite growing quickly since we opened last year.

More than 30 new students have joined the school this year and the Kindergarten class for 2019 is already full, with waitlisting now commenced for a second class.

The school has also welcomed seven new staff members to cater to new students and year groups.

"Not only are we blessed with new facilities, but we are also delighted to have an experienced group of Christian educators to care for our students and families."
