

It's been a warm welcome for new traders Mufasa Biltong – the latest addition to Shorehaven's Neighbourhood and Community Centre in Rise precinct.

Hanru du Plooy, the friendly face behind this specialist local business, is following in the footsteps of his father who started the Mufasa Biltong chain in Currambine in 2009, after noticing a growing desire for good quality biltong and dry wors (dried sausage).

Biltong is a form of dried, cured meat that originated in South Africa, Zimbabwe and Namibia. It can be produced from a variety of different meats including beef and game. It is related to beef jerky in that both products are spiced, dried meats, however the typical ingredients and production

processes are different. Typically, Biltong is not as sweet as jerky and tastes quite different.

"It's been really great meeting all the locals at Shorehaven, new and old customers from our other shops – everyone has been so supportive and I really like the feeling of a beach community," said Hanru. "I'm considering moving here myself in the near future!"

Between Hanru, his brother Marinus and father Johann, there are eight of these popular retail outlets across Perth. From their own family recipes they have produced a large range of gourmet dried and cured meat products including biltong, dry wors and beef sticks, just to name a few.

"The demand for biltong at Shorehaven has been outstanding so we'll be looking to run another special soon on our dry wors or something similar," he said.

While we don't know the tightly-held secrets of the Plooy family recipes, the common ingredients in biltong are meat, black pepper, coriander, salt and vinegar. Modern-day flavourings can include everything from balsamic vinegar, to chilli pepper, garlic and lemon juice.

Food truck trial coming to Waterfront Park

The City of Wanneroo's highly successful food truck trial has been expanded and is coming to Shorehaven at Alkimos!

Starting later this month, the food trucks will set up in the car park next to The Shore Cafe at Waterfront Park every Sunday in the late afternoon.

There'll be heaps of variety and different cuisines to enjoy with the trucks and food offerings changing from week to week with a large number of vendors set to rotate through the Shorehaven site, all members of the Food Truck Association.

Following overwhelming public support for the initiative, the City has decided to extend and expand the trial to all wards and run it throughout the summer and right through until June 2018.

The trial from the first half of 2017 found that 98.5% of residents supported food truck trading within the City, and nearly 80% were keen to see vendors trade all year round.

Commencing at five locations in Madeley, Landsdale, Mindarie, Alexander Heights and Wanneroo, the trial has now been expanded to include a further 11 locations including our very own Shorehaven Beach.

Spring and summer weekends by the beach just got a whole lot better at Shorehaven!

There's a lot of activity coming to Shorehaven over spring and summer including approvals received and preparation for works on the next stage of construction in Coast precinct.

The works, which are expected to start later this month, will include the development of 27 new residential lots as well as an additional road connection into Amberton Estate.

The first release of these new coastal homesites is due in November.

You'll also see new activity around Waterfront Park in the coming months with the commencement of civil works for the construction of a new car park.

Located on the northern edge of the park, this new car park will provide an additional 38 bays and is part of the next stage of development of Waterfront Park – with further announcements to be made shortly.

While the warmer weather has finally arrived, recent wild weather had a

significant impact when it hit Shorehaven and resulted in a gust of sand drift.

We are continuing to work through the clean up and management of sand drift which is an ongoing issue across all new coastal estates – and we thank you for your cooperation during these works. The City of Wanneroo has been in regular contact with us, in response to regular complaints from some residents in relation to sand drift – and that means Renoscape has had to divert its team's efforts away from 'nonessential' maintenance activities to attend to those matters.

Significant sand stabilisation measures are underway in the Coast precinct with a new fence to be erected around the village centre sites, and some 100,000 square metres of hydromulch to be applied across a four week period. Vehicle use on these areas, even when parking on verges, reduces the effectiveness of these treatments and residents are reminded that Off Road Vehicles can be reported to the City of Wanneroo Ranger service on 1300 138 393 when they are causing concerns within the community.

Nonetheless, I am pleased to report that some landscaping works have been achieved, with various streetscapes getting a face lift – including the closing off of Bobstay Brace – and the works at the oval in Rise Precinct still underway and due for completion in November.

You may also be aware that the Metro North-West Joint Development Assessment Panel recently approved the Aegis Aged Care Group's proposed new Magellan Road development after making various changes to the conditions. More good news for Shorehaven!

The development team met with various community members at the recent Open Door sessions, and covered a wide range of topics including maintenance, future development and amenity. We thank all those who attended and look forward to the next session which will be held in December.
