Spring will be a busy time for cleaning and sprucing up community spaces and places at Shorehaven too.

In other works, the temporary access road at Bobstay Brace has now been closed and it's in the process of being transformed to its original purpose – a landscaped walkway. Please be very careful if you're driving or walking in the area while these works are underway.

### Marmion Avenue expansion

The last remaining 11-kilometre singlelane section of Marmion Avenue is set to be widened easing congestion and reducing travel time for residents in Perth's north.

The State Government recently announced it would provide \$23 million to the City of Wanneroo for the upgrade, subject to the Council approving acceptance of the funding. The City of Wanneroo has voted to accept this funding with design and planning set to be undertaken this year, construction to start in 2018 and completion due in 2020.





## Dob in a dumper

There's been a recent spike in illegal dumping around Shorehaven and a considerable amount of rubbish has had to be removed from vacant lots, verges and public open spaces. Fines for minor illegal dumping can be from \$500 or \$2,000 and maximum fines can be up to \$62,500 for individuals.

Anyone seen dumping illegally should be reported to the illegal dumping hotline on 1300 766 541 or the City of Wanneroo's rangers on 9405 5000 or 1300 138 393 after hours.

Helpful information which should only be retrieved if the witness is in no risk include:

- Date, time and place where dumping occurred
- Description of the offender
- Vehicle make, model, colour and registration
- Type of litter or nature of the illegal dumping

Everyone has a role to play in making the community a cleaner and safer place so your assistance is appreciated in this matter.
