DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

Welcome to the first edition of the newsletter for 2018!

It's shaping up to be a great year and with the new park almost complete and ready for action, we are very excited to join with you in celebrating this milestone for the estate.

In other development news, the next stage of works will commence in the coming months to provide 22 new lots in Stage 6A.

Our efforts to manage the local kangaroo population also continue. In consultation with Northern Valleys Wildlife Support Group, City of Wanneroo and the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions (formerly Parks and Wildlife) we are putting together a kangaroo relocation strategy and have already undertaken a recent relocation of a small number of kangaroos prior to the peak of the hot weather with a new relocation company.

As the seasons change, we're continuing to monitor the welfare of the kangaroos in the area as well as the safety of residents and therefore ask if you see any relocators at work, sedating and carefully moving kangaroos, it's important that residents and others stay well away from the area

SIZZLE ON THE BARBECUE

To make the most of the warmer months there is nothing better than a good old barbecue, so here's our top tips for making sure your food is cooked to perfection.

- 1. Get everything you need ready and at hand so you don't have to leave the barbecue once you have started cooking.
- 2. Light the barbecue well ahead of time to allow it to heat up properly before cooking.
- **3.** Don't be afraid to season well with sea salt and pepper to bring out the flavour. You can also marinade your meat which will not only make it taste great, it tenderises it as well. This can be as simple as brushing lightly with olive oil and generously seasoning with salt and pepper.
- **4.** Always give meat enough time out of the fridge at least 20 minutes to lose its chill and be approaching room temperature. If too cold in the centre, it may well burn on the outside before the inside is cooked.
- **5.** Control the proximity of the food to the main source of heat whether that is coals or flames. Shuffle food around from hot patches to cooler patches or place food on foil to slow things down if necessary.
- **6.** Only turn cuts such as chops, lamb and steak once during the cooking to keep them juicy.
- 7. Test 'doneness' using a small sharp knife. Cut into the centre of the meat (down to the bone if there is one) to check that the flesh is cooked to your liking.
- **8.** Finally, rest the meat. This allows it to tenderise and for the juices to reabsorb.
