- Keep verges tidy to keep our community looking good, and boundary trees maintained so they don't overhang neighbours' property.
- If you see anything damaged or out of place – including any signs from Yanchep National Park or golf clubs or balls from Sun City Country Club, be sure to let them know.
- Keep a safe distance from any native wildlife and be sure not to feed them.
- Be conscious of your activities and the potential impact they may have on those around you – whether it's the noise level, or impacting access.

LOCAL SECONDARY COLLEGE SET TO EXPAND



There's good news for Yanchep families with planning for the second stage of Yanchep Secondary College set to begin with a \$13.7 million investment from the State Government.

The College opened its doors this year, with its first intake of close to 600 students from Years 7 to 11. It will expand to Year 12 in 2019.

Stage two of the building program will include a lecture theatre, performing arts centre, music and media facility, visual arts studios and additional student services facilities.


