New housing precinct for Flagstone City

In a major milestone for Flagstone City, a new neighbourhood has been approved within the Greater Flagstone Priority Development Area (PDA). This neighbourhood is located to the west of the Latitude Release and is planned to include more than 1,600 new homes for around 4,500 future Flagstonian residents.

It will contribute significantly to housing supply in one of South-East Queensland's fastest-growing corridors. The new neighbourhood is planned to include:

- 1,631 residential housing lots
- Ambulance Station
- Land for a future state primary school
- Regional sport and recreation facilities
- A new retail and dining precinct
- A mix of housing types including townhouses and large-lot homes
- Green corridors contributing to Flagstone's long-term open space goals

A Plan of Development has been approved to guide future housing delivery and ensure consistent, highquality design outcomes. It sets parameters for building height, setbacks, materials and fencing across the new lots. Construction is expected to commence in August 2025, with first homes anticipated by mid-2026. Flagstone is already home to over 10,000 residents, growing by 40 to 50 new families every month. This approval enables us to expand the range of housing and amenities available to future residents and ensure the ongoing development of around 500 new homes in Flagstone each year. We're proud to build another new precinct that is committed to creating a thriving community where people want to live and supports the continued growth of Flagstone City and the Greater Flagstone PDA, which is planned to be home to over 120,000 residents and deliver over 30,000 jobs across its lifetime.



I would like to thank the 439 residents that took the time to complete our bi-annual resident survey. The research helps us better understand the changing needs and wants of the Flagstone community as it develops and grows. Some of the key findings are:

- Over 80% of residents feel a sense of community and connection - knowing your neighbours and enjoying events and activations held in Flagstone.
- Over 75% of the community felt safe and secure in Flagstone.
- Better lighting on streets and connecting footpaths is desired. This has been shared with relevant stakeholders and is something Peet will look to address in future development.
- Fast-tracking the second access road into Flagstone and improving Teviot Road. Peet is well-aware this is a priority for the community and is working hard with the relevant authorities to progress things.

Overall, it is great to see the majority of Flagstonians are loving their move to the area.

Logan City Council Update

Over the years I have had many conversations regarding crossing Flagstonian Drive between the Adventure Park and the Tigers carpark, and how dangerous it is for pedestrians to cross from one side of the road to the other.

And I totally agree. Many of you by now would of noticed there has been a speed reduction along this section of road to 50km per hour, and this is the first part of making this section just a little bit safer for pedestrians and motorists.

I am happy to let everyone know that funding has been approved via the Division 11 Local Infrastructure Project Funding to install a wombat crossing between these 2 sides of the road. Shortly a raised platform will be installed with a zebra crossing, fencing, improved lighting, tree trimming and improved pram ramps and footpath works, to make sure that people can cross in a safe manner from one side of the road to the other. As soon as I know when this will be completed, I will update the community via social media.




















Deducational and services news

Flagstone Netball Club run a social Fast5 Netball Competition every Tuesday night at their local courts on Flagstonian Drive. The new season will commence on Tuesday 15 July with games held at either 6.15pm or 7pm. The season runs in the school terms, consisting of 14 nights competition and two weeks of finals.

FAST5 is *netball* like you've never seen before, featuring dynamic rules changes including five players a side, shorter quarters, power plays and super shots. The quarters are reduced to six minute, five players a side instead of the traditional seven and has rolling substitutes. At Flagstone it is social, fun and for all skill levels. There are Power Plays to double your score and shots worth one, two or three points, so it's your choice to play safe or take risks for the big points.

Each player will pay a one-off annual registration fee to cover insurances and then a weekly team game fee. If you played season one, you only pay ongoing game fees.
