9 September marked an exciting milestone for Flagstone with the official sod turning of Ashcroft, Flagstone's first over-50s community, proudly delivered by Millbray.

The event brought together key project partners, community representatives and local dignitaries to celebrate the beginning of a new chapter for Flagstone's growing community.

Rob Cross, Millbray's General Manager of Acquisitions, expressed the team's excitement to become part of the Flagstone community - highlighting the area's connectivity to walking paths, retail, dining and medical services.

New Wombat Crossing Completed

Cr Natalie Willcocks has thanked residents for raising the issue of the crossing between the Flagstone Adventure Park and the Tigers Football Oval and has supported this by funding a new wombat crossing via the Division 11 Local Infrastructure Program to provide a safer crossing to one of our busiest family precincts.

This safety upgrade includes:

- Bollards to guide pedestrians safely
- Improved lighting for visibility
- A raised platform design to slow vehicles and prioritise pedestrians

This is a fantastic outcome for families, children, and sports enthusiasts who regularly use this area and will continue working to ensure our infrastructure keeps pace with Flagstone's growth and our community's needs.

How would your friend best describe you?

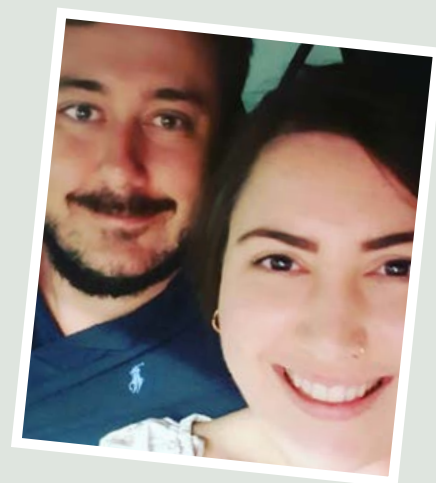
A fun-loving guy who doesn't take life too seriously.
