## A New Milestone in Flagstone's Long-Term Vision

We are proud to share another important milestone in the delivery of Flagstone City, as our long-term vision for a thriving, connected and sustainable community continues to take shape in South-East Queensland.

Recent approvals for a new neighbourhood precinct will deliver more than 1,600 new homes, land for a future state primary school, sports and recreation facilities, and a lively retail and dining hub, reflecting strong collaboration between Peet, government agencies and key stakeholders to support Flagstone's planned growth. This next stage will help meet rising housing demand by offering diverse options for first home buyers, families and downsizers, with construction already underway and the first homes expected from October 2026, boosting both population growth and economic activity in the region.

Alongside residential development, Flagstone's commercial and town centre precincts are also experiencing strong momentum. Recent business openings include World Gym, Swift Storage and Car Cleaners Co. These now sit alongside major brands already established here, including McDonald's, Bridgestone Tyre & Auto, Coles, 7Eleven, PEAK Childcare and a growing number of cafés, bakeries and specialty retailers. These businesses are not only creating jobs, but also helping to build a vibrant and welcoming community where people can work, shop and socialise close to home.

We are also continuing to invest in essential infrastructure and community facilities to support this growth. Two new neighbourhood parks, Citadel Park and Paradise Park, are currently under construction within the Stage 4 Pinnacle Release at Flagstone. These parks, located north of the current Sales Office and Display Village, are scheduled for completion between July and September 2026. Here is what is planned for each:

### Citadel Park

- A half basketball court.
- A picnic shelter.
- Play equipment and swings.
- Open kickabout spaces.

## Te Ngākau Māhaki: Nurturing Culture, Resilience and Community in Flagstone

At the heart of the Flagstone community sits a group that is doing far more than performing traditional Māori arts—it is nurturing identity, healing and connection. Te Ngākau Māhaki, a local Kapa Haka group founded in April 2023, has quickly become a cultural anchor for young people and families in the area.

The group was established by Casey McCarry, a qualified social work practitioner with extensive experience in child protection across both Aotearoa New Zealand and Australia. Casey’s work brings her face to face with some of the most challenging situations affecting children, young people and families entering state care. Witnessing these realities every day inspired her to create a space where Tamariki could feel grounded, empowered and culturally safe.

Te Ngākau Māhaki—meaning “a gentle, humble heart”—was born from this vision. More than a Kapa Haka group, it is a haven built on Māori values, where children can grow their confidence, learn sacred knowledge passed down from ancestors, and strengthen their cultural identity. Through song, movement and shared traditions, participants develop resilience and pride in who they are.

What makes Te Ngākau Māhaki truly unique is its commitment to accessibility. The group operates solely through community support, offering sessions at no cost to families. This ensures that every child, regardless of background or circumstance, has the opportunity to connect to culture in a safe, nurturing environment.

In just a short time, Te Ngākau Māhaki has become a cherished part of the community—a place where culture thrives, identity is celebrated, and young people are supported to stand tall.

## Flagstone Favourites Local Business Awards – Nominations Open 29 May 2026


