Flagstone Continues to Thrive with New Facilities. A Growing Community, and A Bright Future Ahead

There has been a great deal of progress across Flagstone in recent months, with a number of exciting new facilities opening and several major projects continuing to take shape.

The ongoing growth of the community is not only visible in new infrastructure, but also in the increasing vibrancy, opportunity, and lifestyle available to residents.

One of the most significant milestones has been the opening of the new District Community Centre. This highly anticipated facility is already becoming a central hub for connection, learning, and activity within Flagstone. Designed to cater to a wide range of community needs, the centre is providing a welcoming and inclusive space for events, programs, and everyday social interaction. From workshops and meetings to family-friendly activities, the centre is expected to play a key role in bringing people together and strengthening the strong sense of community that Flagstone is known for.

Complementing this is the recent opening of the EMF Performance & Recovery Centre, a state-of-the-art health and wellbeing facility that has generated significant excitement locally. The centre offers a premium fitness experience alongside advanced recovery services, supporting residents in maintaining active and healthy lifestyles. The arrival of such a high-quality facility locally means residents no longer need to travel outside the region for these services, further enhancing convenience and liveability within Flagstone.

Education has also taken an important step forward, with St Bonaventure's College welcoming its first cohort of students. This milestone marks the beginning of a new chapter for families in the area, providing greater access to quality education close to home. The school's opening reflects the growing demand for educational options in the region and reinforces Flagstone's position as a family-friendly community. Looking ahead, planning is already underway for a future public primary school, which is expected to open in 2029. This future investment will further support the needs of a growing population and ensure local families continue to have access to excellent educational opportunities.

Population growth in Flagstone continues at a strong and steady pace, with approximately 40 new families choosing to call the community home each month. This consistent growth is a clear reflection of the area's appeal, driven by its combination of affordability, lifestyle, and ongoing investment in infrastructure. As more people move into the region, Flagstone is evolving into a diverse and dynamic community, rich with opportunity and potential.

Beyond physical development, it is the community spirit of Flagstone that truly sets it apart. This spirit continues to flourish, supported by a strong network of residents, volunteers, and local initiatives. Each year, more than 20 community-led events bring people together, fostering connection, celebration, and a sense of belonging. These events range from family fun days and markets, to cultural celebrations and local gatherings, all contributing to the rich social fabric of the community.

The Flagstone Community Association (FCA), as advocates for local residents, is currently engaging with the community to better understand the need for improved public transport across Flagstone, particularly in Stages 2-5, beyond the Peet Sales Office and St Bonaventure's College.

Over time, there has been growing community feedback and enquiries calling for better access to bus services in these newer areas of the development.

Where Things Currently Stand

In response to these requests, Peet Flagstone has engaged with Translink regarding the possibility of extending bus services further into the estate. While bus indented bays have already been delivered and planned across the community, Translink has advised that there is currently not enough demonstrated demand or supporting evidence to progress additional services at this time.

FCA is now seeking your input to help build a stronger case and provide real community evidence that reflects current needs and challenges with public transport in Flagstone.

We want to hear directly from residents about:

- Gaps in the current system
- Challenges getting to work, school or essential services

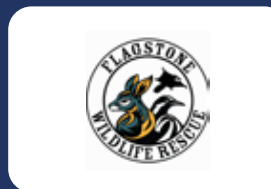

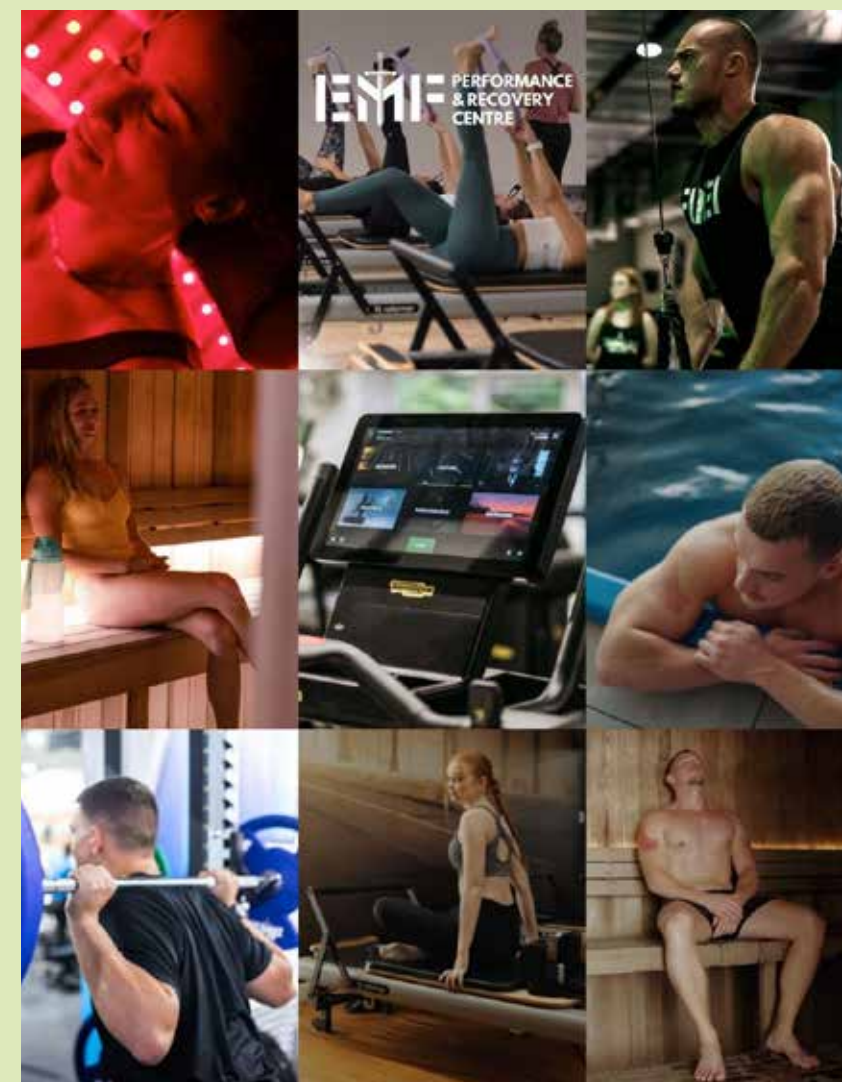
